





Associational Report 2021

Gateway Arizona celebrated our 25th year in 2021! This has only been accomplished by God working through our strong partnership with Arizona Southern Baptists and your support of the Cooperative Program. What a privilege it has been, and will continue to be, to provide "leader-shaping" theological education and training to our Arizona churches.

Campus Report

- Gateway Arizona has graduated a total of 270 students 8 of which were this past May.
- There are currently 72 students taking classes, 21 of which are new. More than 75% of our student body has enrolled in the last 2 years
- Thanks to several churches and individuals, 40 students are receiving financial assistance, totaling nearly \$65,000. We are so very grateful for this continued support and partnership!
- More than half the churches in Arizona have a Gateway Arizona graduate, former student or current student serving in a leadership position

Locations

In an effort to reach all of Arizona with theological training, we utilize several teaching points:

- Phoenix Main I-17 west-side frontage road, north of Cactus Road
- Mesa Campus Valley Rim Baptist Association near Stapley and Brown
- Tucson Campus at Mountain View Baptist Church off Thornydale and Cortaro Farms
- Sierra Vista Campus at Village Meadows Baptist Church

Degrees and Training

There are several ways to gain training from the seminary – even if you've never been to college! Our newest degree offering is the Masters of Theological Essentials. This 36 credit-hour degree provides a basic knowledge and skills training for those called to ministry service. Bible classes, theology and church-history courses provide an overall foundation for relevant and effective service in today's world.

Gateway offers several degree programs, including two doctorates (Doctor of Philosophy and Doctor of Ministry), and multiple types of Master's degree, including theology, education, counseling, church -planting, missiology and more. There is a path for you at Gateway, no matter what your spiritual and educational journey is to this point!

Certificate Program at Gateway Arizona

The mission of Gateway Seminary is to provide graduate-level instruction that "shapes leaders who expand God's kingdom around the world." But in talking with leaders from around the state, we came to see a real-life need for spiritual education all across our great state. So, instead of expecting folks to travel to Phoenix for training, we're bringing it to you. Now you can take courses in Phoenix, Mesa, Tucson, and Sierra Vista!

The certificate program at Gateway Seminary is where the classroom meets real-life! We host these courses on local church campuses, so it's easier to get to. But more than that, the students who take the certificate classes are just like you— from your neighborhood, experiencing the same issues and opportunities in their church, as you are in yours. You'll learn a lot from the instructor, because every one of them has proven faithful in ministry. But you'll also hear what your other students are doing to be more effective in reaching Arizona for Jesus. It isn't just about learning information in a class-room...it's about applying that knowledge and wisdom in effective ways, making disciples right in your local church.

The requirements for taking Certificate classes are simple:

- Are you 25 year old or older?
- Do you have a high school diploma or its equivalent?
- Are you a church-member with a potential for leadership in your church

If you answered "YES" to these questions, you'll want to enroll in one of our certificates:

- The *Bible Teaching Certificate* is designed to give you a greater insight into the content and message of the Bible, and ways of presenting the Bible more effectively in the local church. This includes Bible studies, Sunday school, home groups, and personal discipleship/ This is for anyone who desires to grow in their teaching skills.
- The Children's Ministry Certificate gives you the opportunity to acquire essential skills for ministering to children and their families in the 21st century.
- The **Collegiate Ministry Certificate** help to equip people to minister effectively to college students, including training in discipleship, evangelism, missions, and leadership.
- The Church Revitalization Certificate will give pastors, re-planters and revitalizers greater
 insight and instruction in church transformations as well as create a local network of revitalizers. It provides church revitalization knowledge and tools that can help to ensure a higher level of success in revitalization efforts in the region.
- The Pastoral Care Certificate provides local church leaders the practical skills needed to
 minister effectively to the emotional an spiritual need of others. It provides appropriate pastoral care for the whole person and a working knowledge of the theories and techniques of
 Christian counseling, and the skills to become better equipped to enhance the local church
 body.

The collegiate ministry of the Arizona Southern Baptist Convention

2021 Annual Report

2021 was a challenging year with almost every campus closed to on-campus interaction. Our missionaries got creative with technology to try to connect with new students, share the gospel and develop disciples and young leaders.

We had active chapters on 13 campuses partnering with 12 churches during the 2020-2021 school year (the COVID Year as it will come to be known). Some ministry numbers for the school year: 1740 student contacts, 448 students involved, 106 student leaders, 29 conversions/baptisms, 148 involved in evangelism, 31 preparing for vocational ministry, 270 involved in discipleship groups, 39 international students involved, 214 involved in mission projects.

We provided multiple state events; most were virtual, and one had to be canceled due to COVID. Our Impact Missions Experience was scheduled for Yuma for October 2020. This event would have seen 200 or so students come together for missions education and a day of serving alongside Yuma Baptist Association churches in outreach activities all over the area on both sides of the border, but because of the hands-on nature of the experience could not be done safely and responsibly. We are planning it for October of 2022. In February 2021, we were able to hold our Surge Discipleship Retreat virtually with over 170 participating and our April Propel Leader Training was virtual as well. This event trained student leaders how to share their faith using gospel appointments and how to lead small group, missional Bible studies (called Challenge Communities) with their peers.

Christian Challenge missionaries and students have long been serving teenagers at Zona's summer Youth Camp. Missionaries train and lead the students (called Zona Crew) to share the gospel with teenagers and be involved in their lives during the week of Zona. This year 20 students and 7 missionaries served. One Crew member had the opportunity to lead someone to Christ for the first time in her life!

The Fall semester this year, coming out of COVID, is absolutely strategic for our missionaries. The COVID -closed campuses of 2020-2021 severely limited most chapter's opportunities to reach a whole class of students. Missionaries have planned and are praying for extensive connections with not only freshmen but also sophomores to close that gap. And, now that most campuses are open, missionaries are chomping at the bit to mobilize student leaders to reach the campus!

Arizona Disaster Relief Annual Report 2021

On behalf of Arizona Disaster Relief Ministry, thank you for your prayers and support of Disaster Relief.

This year has brought us many opportunities in Arizona and beyond.

In 2020, we had about 34 new volunteers trained at our annual training in feeding, chainsaw, recovery, shower, and driver courses. We also had a regional training in Yuma where about 10 other people were trained in shower. With Covid, training for 2021 was put on the back burner, but development continued to provide our required introduction class online. We have begun to do more regional trainings in 2021 and hope to continue with that model in the coming years.

Over the course of 2020, although much was shut down due to the pandemic, your Arizona Disaster Relief Team continued to work. In April and May, the Yuma team worked in their community to provide showers to those in need. In May, a team was sent to Texas to help with recovery after the tornadoes. Also in May, our feeding teams provided 3 meals a day for the whole month to a shelter for high-risk homeless people set up by Maricopa County Health and Human Services. June brought another local Arizona opportunity to feed those affected by the Globe and Tucson area fires. We sent a team to Texas to help with assessments and chainsaw work in September after the hurricanes. October was filled with work in Louisiana working on hurricane cleanup doing chainsaw work and providing shower and laundry services. The year ended in November with assessment and fire clean up in Colorado after the East Troublesome and Cameron Peak fires.

Throughout 2020, we had volunteers pitch in and help at their local food banks as a support to their community as volunteers were scarce in these locations. We had others volunteer to help in their county's emergency management teams to help distribute PPE gear to those who needed it the most.

In 2021, about 65 people completed online Introduction training through our new online "Involving Southern Baptists in Disaster Relief." We had two regional trainings, one housed at Calvary Baptist Church in Lake Havasu City and the other in Casa Grande at Trinity Southern Baptist Church. The regional training in Lake Havasu City provided opportunities for people to train in feeding, chainsaw, and recovery. Trinity's regional training included feeding and shower.

In June our feeding team was in Dudleyville, Arizona supporting clean-up efforts from the Margo Fire. July saw 13 volunteers travel to Granby, CO to continue fire clean-up efforts begun in November and suspended because of deep snow.

As disasters continue to occur, your Arizona teams will respond as we are needed, but we can only do that with your prayers and support. It is because of you, Arizona Southern Baptists, and your faithful giving to the Arizona Mission Offering and to Disaster Relief that our team is able to share the love of Jesus to those next door as well as those around the country. Thank you for your faithfulness to help us serve others by bringing Help, Hope and Healing through Southern Baptist Disaster Relief.

 - 5. To provide and equip designated women mentors in each association, for the purpose of serving the women leaders in their particular associations.
 - 6. To provide a variety of resources to aid in the tasks of women who serve the church including biblical resources, curriculum, formats, venues, learning styles, methods, and additional avenues to successfully accomplish their role and how they serve in their church.

Our team serves women in various ministry settings of their church including:

Wives of ministers (pastor, church planting, worship, additional ministry leaders) Bible teachers for children and women, missionaries, women ministry directors, and other various roles and titles that women serve within their local church

For eight years, Simone Lake has served as the AZSBC state Director of Women Ministry Ministry as well as the Women Ministry Leader for Valley Rim Association https://azsbc.org/womens-ministry/

Teaching / Training / Equipping,

AZSBC Women Ministry Team provides Biblical education, teaching, and training as well as a variety of resources for women in ministry and the churches they serve. Partnering with other trained women leaders around the state, we are sent out, upon invitation to teach, train, and equip other women within their own ministry and church setting.

This 2020/2021 year Simone and others on the AZSBC Women Ministry Team have successfully trained over 50 women and successfully impacted each of the churches these women represent. Including one on one, mentoring, Bible teaching, Prayer and Spiritual Disciplines, conferences, Various topical leadership training, workshops, discipleship, webinars, ZOOM teachings, videos, Bible studies, and more.

Gateway Seminary Women's Network

This program leads women in various areas of ministry, connecting them to a personal mentor, resources, interactive live webinars, and other resources designed to equip them in the various areas they serve their church. This program connects Arizona mentees with an Arizona mentor who will help foster ministry growth and leadership skills in these areas: Discipleship, Image Identity, Leader Development, Life Skills Ministry/Family Balance, Stress Management, and more. Each woman who successfully completes this 1-year program will receive a certificate. This program can be taken each year as new teachers and topics change each year. Over 25 women have successfully completed this program and over 25 churches were blessed by the training these women have completed and been able to implement immediately in their churches https://www.gs.edu/womens-network-registration/

Valley Rim Southern Baptist Association 2021 Annual Meeting Association Mission Strategist Written Report

I am happy to report to you that despite the many challenges we faced in 2020, the work of the gospel continued in 2021 in and through the churches of Valley Rim Southern Baptist Association. The challenges that you and all of our churches have faced have been difficult to say the least. Yet the resilience of our churches is astonishing.

Despite all that happened in 2020, it provided the staff and team leaders the opportunity to work together, albeit virtual in many cases, to zero in on the purpose and work of Valley Rim. As a result we rolled into 2021 with a more clear picture of the task at hand. Our mission is to foster relationships among pastors, leaders, and churches that leads to greater kingdom impact.

With a clear target, we set out to implement a strategy that would assist us in hitting that target. The strategy is simple, it's all about connecting. Connecting pastors and churches to relationships, solutions, and mission. I'm not asking you to memorize it, commit to a new initiative, or asking you to preach a series on it. I simply want you to be aware that Valley Rim staff and volunteer team leaders are proactively working together to hit the target.

We aligned our new strategy with our existing structure. Our pastoral care team provides intentional care to pastors and their families. Our equipping and training team connects our churches to practical solutions to help meet unique ministry needs. Our church planting team connects churches to mission by encouraging kingdom results through local church collaboration.

In order to accomplish any of these things we recognized that as a staff and volunteer team we needed to have more contact with our pastors and churches. Since arriving at Valley Rim we have increased our contacts with you each year, but somewhat marginally, with our greatest number of contacts landing slightly over 400 in 2020. This year we mobilized the entire team to prioritize personal connections, and we are anticipating having over a 1000 contacts with pastors and leaders of our churches by the end of 2021.

The number of contacts is not our primary goal. Yet it has been a key contributor in our ability to build new relationships, and improve established relationships. It has already increased our ability to connect pastors to care, leaders to solutions, and churches to mission.

It is an honor and privilege to serve the churches of Valley Rim. In 2022 we will continue to move forward. We will continue to foster relationships within our association of churches that lead to greater kingdom impact. Pursuing kingdom expansion and community transformation. We will multiply in our neighborhoods and abroad, pursue the well being of our cities, and pray to the Lord of the harvest (Jer 29:7).

Equipping and Training Team Report

2021 has been a year of refocusing for the Equipping and Training Team. As a part of the Valley Rim Association's efforts to take the "Next Step Funds" and use them to invest in our churches, we have been evaluating how best to equip our churches and invest those resources in our churches' ministry growth and goals.

The Equipping and Training Team desires to make all of the Next Step Funds allotted to our team available to invest in individual churches. Churches may request Next Step funds from the E.T. team for the purpose of reaching a specific group of people, beginning a new ministry, overcoming a specific ministry challenge, or to provide training or resources that will allow a church to take a step in their ministry growth.

When a church presents a request to the E.T. Team, a representative from the team would love to meet with the pastor requesting funds to learn more about the church's needs, vision, and goals. Our desire is to come along side churches as they take their next steps, not to dictate those steps, but to see how we can assist and resource them along the way. The E.T. team can assist churches not just with funds, but also through potential trainings and partnerships.

The hope of the E.T. Team is that the Next Step Funds allotted to us will be an opportunity to further develop and identify greater partnership and cooperation opportunities between Valley Rim churches. Our hope is to see our churches discover new ways to serve and support one another as we all strive to serve our Lord.

As an example this past year, HiWay Baptist Church came alongside FBC Apache Junction to help begin a new mid week children's ministry at FBCAJ this summer. This was a goal that FBCAJ had been praying about and volunteers at FBCAJ had offered to serve. HiWay was able to help them take that next step by providing resources and curriculum that HiWay had available, as well as offering training and encouragement.

The E.T. Team looks forward to helping facilitate partnerships like these between churches this upcoming year as we invest these Next Step Funds in our churches.

Next Steps Funds:



BY-LAWS

BY-LAWS

Valley Rim Southern Baptist Association

Article I - Name

This nonprofit corporation shall be called the Valley Rim Southern Baptist Association (The Association), an Arizona nonprofit.

Article II - Objects

Section 1

The object of the association is to foster relationships amongst the churches of Valley Rim for greater kingdom impact.

Section 2

Recognizing that the association is in no sense an ecclesiastical one, the Association shall under no circumstances attempt to exercise any legislative or ecclesiastical authority over or interfere with the right and autonomy of the churches. The Association shall embrace the orderly Baptist churches now in cooperation with it and such others as may hereafter be admitted to this body.

The Association recognizes each local church as being independent and sovereign in all matters. The basis of operation in the Association shall stem solely from the voluntary cooperation of the churches constituting this organization. The Association may, however, provide advisory counsel upon invitation.

Section 3

The Association may acquire property both personal and real, and shall have power to sell or encumber the same.

Article III - Membership

Section 1

The Association shall be composed of messengers of such Baptist Churches within its membership as shall have applied for affiliation, and have been accepted by the Association at an Annual Meeting, provided the church or churches making such application shall have adopted Articles of Faith acceptable to the Association, and shall have subscribed to this Constitution. Churches which desire membership may be accepted into a Watch Care relationship at any Administrative Team meeting until a decision is made at the Annual Meeting. Known entities, other Southern Baptist Churches, may be accepted for full membership at any Administrative Team meeting in accordance with the aforementioned conditions.

Section 2

Churches desiring representation with this body shall petition by letter and representation. The Administrative Team shall consider the petition or petitions and report its findings to the Association for final action at its Annual Meeting.

Section 3

It shall be the duty of each cooperating church to make an annual report to the Association, giving names of the messengers, the statistics and financial condition of the church and any other helpful information as called for in the Annual Church Profile sent out by the Arizona Southern Baptist Convention or as required by the Association.

Section 4

If any church fails to report as required by the Association for two (2) consecutive years, the Administrative Team shall investigate their standing and report to the Association at its next Annual Meeting.

Section 5

When any church fails to report to the Association for three (3) consecutive years, the church shall enter a probationary period until such time that they report to the Association. When a church is under a probationary status they cannot request or receive Association funds.

Section 6

While the Association does not assume any authority over the churches in its fellowship, it does reserve the right to withdraw or withhold the hand of fellowship from any church which has become corrupt in faith or practice as determined by a vote at any Annual or Special called meeting of the Association.

Section 7

Each church recognized by the Association shall be entitled to five (5) messengers, and one (1) additional messenger for every twenty-five (25) resident members in excess of fifty (50) provided that no church shall have more than fifteen (15) messengers.

Article IV - Officers

The officers of the Association shall be the President, the Vice President, the Clerk, the Treasurer, and three (3) Trustees.

Section 1

Election of officers shall take place at the Annual Associational Meeting. They shall take office on the January 1st that immediately follows the Annual Meeting in which they were elected and they shall serve for an annual term. No President shall succeed himself more than once. When a vacancy occurs in between Annual Meetings for the offices of Clerk, Treasurer, or Trustee, the Administrative Team may appoint someone to serve the remainder of the term.

Section 2

The President shall preside over all annual and special called meetings of the Association and Administrative Team Meetings. The Vice President shall preside when the President is absent or at the request of the President. In the absence of both the President and Vice President, a Trustee shall preside over the meeting.

Section 3

The Clerk shall send out notices of meetings, keep an accurate record of all meetings of the Association and the Administrative Team, and shall be custodian any documents belonging to the Association, and shall file a copy of the minutes of each meeting of the Association and Administrative Team for perpetuity.

Section 4

The Treasurer of the Association shall receive and keep a strict account of all Association funds and shall make a monthly report to the Administrative Team and an annual report to the Association at the Association's Annual Meeting.

Section 5

Trustees shall act as the signers for any properties or materials purchased or obtained by the Association. Trustees shall have no power to buy, sell, mortgage, lease, or transfer any property without a vote by the Administration Team or the Association authorizing each action.

Article V - The Administrative Team

Section 1

All work of the Association shall be under the supervision of the Administrative Team consisting of the officers of the Association and the Associational Staff.

Section 2

Any member of any Valley Rim Church may attend Administrative Meetings and may participate in discussions, ask questions, make suggestions and receive documents of the meeting. Only Administrative Team members shall make motions, amend motions, and/or vote.

Section 3

The Administrative Team shall transact any and all business of the Association in between annual meetings, with the exception of special called meetings, provided that nothing shall be done by the Administrative Team contrary to these By-Laws or to the expressed will of the Association. The Administrative Team shall be responsible for preparing an annual budget to present to the Association at the Annual meeting, for receiving and evaluating nominations for Ministry Team Leader positions of the Association, and for overseeing the day to day personnel matters of the Association.

Section 4

The Administrative Team shall write and keep current, subject to the approval of the Association, an Operations Manual of the Association.

Section 5

The Administrative Team shall make an annual report to the Association of all work done by the Administrative Team, of monies received and how disbursed, of missionaries or other workers employed, salaries paid, of field workers, of needy fields, giving itemized statements of all receipts and disbursements, and such matters as pertaining to the business of the Association, with such recommendations and suggestions as the Administrative Team deems wise.

Section 6

The regular meetings of the Administrative Team shall be monthly.

Article VI - Ministry Teams

Section 1

The following Ministry Teams are hereby established to strengthen and unify relationships, trust, and teamwork amongst the churches of the Valley Rim to fulfill the great commission: Pastoral Care & Connections, Training & Equipping, and Church Planting.

Section 2 - Team Leaders

Each Ministry Team shall have a Team Leader elected at an Association's Annual Meeting to a two (2) year term. The term will officially begin on the January 1st that immediately follows the Annual Meeting in which they were elected. No Team Leader may serve more than two consecutive terms. A candidate for a Ministry Team Leader position shall first be nominated to the Administrative Team for consideration before an Annual Meeting. The Administrative Team shall review all nominations for Team Leader positions in conjunction with the requirements for Team Leaders as described in the Association's Operations Manual. After review, the Administrative Team shall recommend qualified candidates to the Association for consideration at the Annual Meeting.

In the event of a vacancy of a Team Leader position in between Annual Meetings, the Ministry Team with a vacancy shall nominate a current member of their team to the Administration Team to serve as Team Leader. Upon the Administrative Team's approval the nominated Team Member shall serve as Team Leader for the remainder of the current term.

Section 3 – Team Membership

Team Members are to be enlisted annually by the Team Leader who has been elected to serve during the upcoming year. A list of prospective Team Members is to be presented to the Administration Team for consideration in conjunction with the requirements for Team Members as described in the Association's Operations Manual and approval before the beginning of the following year. Team members serve for a term of one (1) year, and cannot serve on the same team for more than three (3) consecutive terms. Team Leaders are encouraged to enlist as many Team Members as needed to ensure that the ministry role of the Team to Valley Rim Churches is faithfully and effectively fulfilled.

Section 4 - Team Descriptions

Duties of these Teams shall be as their names indicate in keeping with the promotion of a Southern Baptist program of work or as instructed at an Annual Association Meeting or by the Administrative Team.

Training and Equipping Team: Equip and resource the churches of the Association through ministry, training, and leadership development events and opportunities.

Pastoral Care and Connections: Work with the Associational Mission Strategist to care for, connect with, and minister to pastors in the Association.

Church Planting Team: Evaluate needs, enlist sponsors and partners, and monitor partnerships with the goal of each new start having Church Starting as a part of its spiritual DNA. Missions and Mission giving shall be a part of this team.

Article VII - Meetings

Section 1

The Association shall meet annually for worship, the transaction of business, and celebration of the work. All of the ministries will work in conjunction with the Administration Team to organize and prepare all aspects of the annual meeting.

Section 2

Special meetings may be called and the time and place of the Annual Meeting may be changed by the Administrative Team in case an emergency arises deemed sufficient to justify such action. A group of messengers representing at least seven (7) Valley Rim congregations may request a Special Associational Meeting which the Administrative Team is mandated to call.

Section 3

The current edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall be the guide in all matters pertaining to the conduct of business sessions of the Association. The preferred means of making decisions within this form of polity shall be "consensus".

Article VIII - Associational Staff

The Association may call an Associational Mission Strategist and such other staff as are needed and for which funds are available to support.

Article IX - Budgeting & Funds

Section 1

The Fiscal year for the Valley Rim Southern Baptist Association shall be January 1 - December 31.

Section 2

The annual budget of the Association may be changed at any Annual or Special Meeting of the Association or by the Administrative Team. When funds exceed the present budget the Administrative Team may choose to pass these funds along to the Ministry Teams as needed with a full report being made to the Association. Personnel salaries can only be adjusted by a vote at an Annual or Special Meeting of the Association.


Section 3

Designated funds shall be administered by the Teams responsible for the designated areas of ministry. Team budgets will be administered by their respective Team with full report being made to the Administrative Team and the Association.

Article X - Amendments

These By-Laws may be amended upon recommendation of the Administrative Team at any Annual Meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting. Written notice of the proposed amendment and a full copy of the By-laws with the proposed amendment shall be given to the churches at least sixty (60) days before the Annual Meeting of the Association. When titles and program ministry names change in Southern Baptist Life, these changes may be reflected in the next typing of the Constitution.

These bylaws were approved at the Annual Meeting of the Association on 13th of October 2020.

Spiritual Qualifications: For all positions, we are seeking mature disciples who are active members in a Valley Rim Southern Baptist church or one affiliated with the Valley Rim Association. Those interested should demonstrate a concern for strengthening existing churches, developing leaders and a sense of mission service.

Associational President

Position Assignment:

The person shall complete a questionnaire provided by the Administrative Team.

The position is voluntary.

The Administrative Team can consent to mileage and ministry related expenses if it so chooses.

While cooperating with the Associational Director, this position reports to the participating churches comprising the Valley-Rim Association.

The duration of the position is for one year. Each annual meeting will elect or re-elect an associational president. A person may serve no more than two consecutive one-year terms.

Principal Responsibilities:

In coordination with the Associational Director this position will provide responsible leadership in the work of the association through the Teams of the Association.

Encourage fellowship among the churches and their leadership.

Planning: Work with the Associational Director and Treasurer on the annual budget and strategic plan.

Visit pastors, staffs, churches, and mission as available.

Counsel churches and leaders as requested and available.

Serve the churches as requested and available.

Position Descriptions for Valley Rim Association

Associational Vice-President

Position Assignment:

The person shall complete a questionnaire provided by the Administrative Team.

The position is voluntary.

The Administrative Team can consent to mileage and ministry related expenses if it so chooses.

While cooperating with the Associational Director, this position reports to the participating churches comprising the Valley-Rim Association.

The duration of the position is for one year. Each annual meeting will elect or re-elect an associational vice-president. A person may serve no more than two consecutive one-year terms.

Principal Responsibilities:

In coordination with the Associational Director and President this position will provide responsible leadership in the work of the association through the Teams of the association.

Encourage fellowship among the churches and their leadership.

Planning: Work with the Associational Director and Teams to calendar, resource, budget, and implement annual and long-range planning.

Visit pastors, staffs, churches, and mission as available.

Counsel churches and leaders as requested and available.

Serve the churches as requested and available.

Valley Rim Team Leader Qualifications

- A personal testimony of salvation, discipleship, and Christ honoring character.
- An active member of a Valley Rim church.
- Some form of ministry experience that is relative to the ministry team they are nominated to lead.
- Experience leading others and organizing teams.

Valley Rim Team Leader Responsibilities

- Monthly Contact List This will be a rotating list split evenly among team leaders to include Pres., Vice Pres, and AMS to ensure contact is spread evenly and multiple touches are being made each year. Three areas of emphasis for every contact: Soul Care, Resources, Mission.
- Each team leader will be required to submit a monthly report detailing contacts, significant ministry, and future plans.
- A budget meeting will be held in August. A-Team will review and vote on proposed budget in September. Budget will be approved at Annual Meeting in October.
- Each team leader will develop and submit annual plan and goals by November for the following calendar year to be reviewed with AMS. Implementation will begin in January of following year.
- Collectively plan events for pastors that fall in one of the three areas of ministry
- Each team leader is responsible for building and maintaining a healthy team
- Pastoral Care
 - o Building groups that encourage pastors to provide care, share resources, and collaborate on mission amongst themselves.
 - o Increase care for wives/families
- Equipping & Training
 - o Provide new avenues of equipping & training in a virtual world
 - ◆ Create content to be shared monthly making use of VR pastors & leaders
 - Ex: blog, vlog, podcast
 - o Gather & Share new resources
- Church Planting
 - o Develop Leadership Cohort
 - Engage existing church planters
 - Engage existing churches
