





Gateway Arizona celebrated our 22nd year in 2018! This is the result of God working through our strong partnership with Arizona Southern Baptists and your support of the Cooperative Program. What a privilege it has been, and will continue to be, to provide theological education and leadership development to our Arizona churches.

- * Gateway Arizona has graduated 177 students. More than half the churches in Arizona have a Gateway Arizona graduate, former student or current student serving in a leadership position.
- * We currently have about 90 students taking classes this fall, 25 of which are new. More than 75% of our student body has enrolled in the last 2 years.
- * Graduation ceremonies celebrated 20 graduates in May 2017. That's almost 40 graduates over the last 2 years!
- * Thanks to several churches and individuals, as well as a foundation established to help students called to missions, 40 students are receiving financial assistance. We are grateful for this continued support and partnership!

One reason for our success is the ability to create and nurture relationships with local leaders. Here are just a few ways that Gateway is partnering with you:

- * A new facelift on the campus was completed this year. The smaller classroom can now comfortably seat 14-16 students, and the office area was expanded, making room for a new staff person, and a small faculty lounge area was completed.
- * Many people have benefitted from our intentional coaching relationships. By asking powerful questions and expecting commitment, coaching helps you clarify direction and achieve God's best for yourself and your church. This coaching is open to anyone who is ready to take the "next step!"
- * The 15-hour Church Planting Certificate complements our state's vision of planting 500 churches in the next few years. It offers church-planting skills as well as a coaching network for those involved in starting new works around the state. Currently, 16 students are training in this program.
- * The Bible Teaching Certificate has been met with great enthusiasm across the state. This is a 15-hour certificate that trains anyone desiring to grow in their knowledge of the Bible, and their skill in teaching the Word!
- * We continue to expand our reach throughout the state, with classes held in:
- o Scottsdale: main campus at Hayden Road and Oak
- o Northside Campus: Calvary Community Church
- o Payson: Payson Christian School
- o Tucson: Mountain View Baptist Church

Arizona Baptist Children's Services & Family Ministries (ABCS)

ABCS is a foster care licensing agency, partnering with the state to license loving, Christian families to provide foster and/or adoptive homes for children in care. ABCS works alongside churches to help create awareness about the need for loving foster homes and to recruit Christian families. Our Arms of Love Foster Care team is available to meet with you, bring resources to one of your church services and speak to your congregation. Orphan Sunday is coming up on November 11, and the entire month of November is National Adoption Month. Please call us to connect with our team about orphan care. So far this year 50 children have been adopted through ABCS, and 215 children are currently in Arms of Love foster homes.

ABCS now has an office on the campus of North Phoenix Baptist Church that is focused on promoting foster care and supporting foster and adoptive families. We are blessed to be able to partner with churches to meet the needs of hurting children. The church is hosting Kelly Minter's Cultivate, a

woman's gathering, in September and will allow us to share about the ministry at the event.

Pursue Life Adult Ministry's third Travel with a Purpose Mission Cruise to the Caribbean is coming up in 2019. The trip is intended to introduce those aged 50+ to service ministry and missions. This particular travel experience removes some of the issues that cause anxiety and keep older adults from ministry outside their local communities. Registration is now open and will close October 31, 2018. A ministry cruise can be a life-changing experience that leads to new ministry in local communities or an international mission trip. ABCS staff served at Zona Camp again this year. A few of our New Life Counseling team members were there to provide counseling and crisis intervention. This is the fifth year that New Life counselors have been at Zona. New Life Pregnancy Center (NLPC) representatives were there again this year to host a workshop on pregnancy and abortion, as well as a workshop for leaders that was a domestic violence simulation. Leaders walked through the life of an individual living in domestic violence, experiencing what it is like to be faced with danger and uncertainty and needing to make decisions along the way. After the simulation, leaders were involved in an in-depth discussion on how to identify warning signs among their students and church families and how to provide compassionate help to those experiencing domestic violence.

Missions Education is the heart of Arizona Woman's Missionary Union (AZ WMU). We promote, train, encourage, and resource churches for missions education.

Our team has had the opportunity to go to Sunizona and to Thatcher to train churches in churchwide and agelevel missions education.

WMU offers online leader training for all age level groups as well as offering an online Leadership Certificate Program which consists of nine courses in the areas of Leadership Foundations, Leadership Formation, and Leadership Skills.

For our children, AZ WMU has a Children's Mission Camp at Emmanuel Pines Camp in Prescott each year. 2018 Transition Team Report

After Jim Martin stepped down as the Director of Missions in the Valley Rim Association, the Valley Rim Staff in conjunction with the A-team formed a Transition Team. The purpose of this Transition Team was to first evaluate the ministry structure of the association and then begin the process of searching for the next Director of Missions for the association.

Since its formation earlier this year, the Transition Team has focused on this first task of evaluating the ministry structure of the association. We conducted interviews and meetings with several pastors in our association and reviewed feedback previously gathered by the association. We desired to *narrow in* on what pastors and churches felt were their greatest needs and the ways they felt the association could best contribute to and support their ministries. In fact after much discussion, we felt that part of the association's structure and values needed to reflect a ministry culture that continually asked these questions of our pastors and churches. We also strove to carefully consider the unique and wide variety of churches that make-up our Valley Rim Association.

After much prayerful evaluation, discussion, and reflection it became clear that for the association to continue to be an effective and valuable resource to our churches that we needed to focus on strengthening our relationships with one another as churches. We recognize that this is not something that just happens, but something that takes communication, trust, and time to develop. None the less, the facilitating and fostering of these relationships between our churches for the sake of the gospel of Jesus Christ is foundational to why our association exists. As such, we propose this purpose statement for the Valley Rim:

The Valley Rim Association exists to strengthen and unify relationships, trust, and teamwork amongst the churches of the Valley Rim to fulfill the great commission.

2018 Transition Team Report Continued

Furthermore in light of the needs and priorities which were presented to us from our pastors and churches, we identified three particular ministry areas through which we best felt our association could strive to strengthen and grow these relationships. These three areas of ministry also reflected the most often mentioned areas of needs in the feedback which we received. These three areas of ministry are Pastoral Care and Connections, Equipping and Training, and Church Planting. We feel that "simplifying" the ministry structure of the association to these three teams will help to streamline communication and ministry between our pastors, churches, and associational leadership.

As a team we are proposing a number of changes to the Valley Rim Association by-laws to reflect this new ministry structure. It should be noted that the Transition Team was primarily focused on the ministry structure of the association and not all aspects of the by-laws or its administrative policies. However, we are recommending a few changes to a couple of additional areas of the by-laws, which we felt needed to be addressed or clarified immediately. This team would also recommend that the association consider doing a more thorough review of the entire by-laws and highly consider evaluating and updating its Policy and Procedure Manual.

At this point the team is preparing for its next task of prayerfully pursuing the man God has called to lead our association of churches forward.

Education Directors Report

Congregational Strengthening/ Evangelism Team/ Education Director's Report

1. The CST (led by Simone Lake) and Evangelism Team (led by Mark Pratt) met monthly this year. Both teams met each church request with financial resources, physical resources and training. The teams responded well to the Valley Rim reorganization plan. We bring Mark Pratt to the Association to lead the Equipping Training Team with a new team structure should it pass. Most of the team members plan to continue on as regional representatives in the new structure.

2. Vacation Bible School

- ◆ Game On" VBS Clinic was held May 19th @CrossPoinTempe. Attendance was under 20. Next year we will provide church consultation upon request.
- ◆ Palm Valley Mission Partnership- June 11-15. The team was hosted by HiWay Baptist Church. They served the following churches: International Baptist Ministries, Longmore Rd., Desert Community, Every Tribe Every Nation, Willow Grove, Ferguson Memorial, Light in the Desert, McQueen Rd. Baptist, and Family of Faith Fellowship.
- **3. Summer Missionaries** We had a team of four this year- Dylan Tenney, Michael Vogt, Cheyanne Peery, and Brittney Hintz. They served multiple churches helping with VBS and worked as counselors at Zona Yuth and Character Challenge Children's Camp.

4. Character Challenge Children's Camp- Director, Kelcey Fry

Week One (June, 6/24-29) -Week Two (July- 1-6) Both weeks filled. Over 200 children enjoyed perfect weather, injury-free activities, delicious food, and inspiring bible study and worship.

- **5.** Worship Co-Op-Director Cliff Merrill held an evening of praise and prayer at College View. We had a team of 9 worship leaders/musicians from 7 different churches. About 30 attended the event. The Co-Op served College View and Light in the Desert this year as well as providing music at special events and coverage for worship leaders.
- 6. **Two Deacon & Wives Training Events-** One was held May 20 at Gateway Fellowship. The second training was held September 16 at Heart of Mesa. Over 80 were trained.

7. Short Term Mission Trips

Thailand Medical Missions Valley Rim sent a team of 16 to assist IMB missionary, Dr. Doug Derbyshire. We conducted 3 medical clinics and did ministry in local schools. This trip we traveled to the tsunami area and assisted survivors with evangelism projects.

Kenya, Africa (August)

Three Valley Rim missionaries served with Ancient Promise in Nairobi, Kenya. We trained ministry leaders to create Bible lessons and sermons using in-depth, inductive Bible Study.

CHURCH PLANTING TEAM REPORT



Maricopa County is the fastest growing county in our country with 74,000 net new people. This translates to just over 202 net people per day in our county. It doesn't take a math wizard to figure out, with all our churches in Maricopa county total, we are not reaching a new 74,000 people per year.

Obviously, making disciples and Starting New churches in underserved communities is an essential and Biblical strategy to spread the Gospel across the Valley. This year we witnessed a surge in Ethnic church planting. Filipino, Haitian, Ghanian, and Spanish starts are emerging.

The approach is multi-faceted; two of those facets are being carefully considered by Valley Rim Association. First is aiding our existing churches in connection and health so they can move from existence to multiplication. The other is planting new churches where a local community or people group has been void of a Jesus community.

<u>Replanting:</u> a term given to retool a church which has been depleted, or lost touch with its community. This church usually has little to no hope of recovering without a new vision and leadership. Our Association, State, and North American Mission Board are teaming together to Replant those congregations willing to go through the process of Rebirth. Two such congregations are:

- Light in the Desert = Bryan Jerry, replanting pastor
- Every Tribe & Nation = Josh Hodges, replanting pastor

2018 Associational Directors Report

In January of this year, I met with the Administrative Team for the Valley Rim and accepted the call to serve as the interim DOM. At that time, I was given the opportunity to share, and while there were few words of my own that are of any significance, I did read a passage of Scripture that has continually had a profound impact on my ministry for the last decade.

1 Corinthians 1:27-29

"Instead, God has chosen what is foolish in the world to shame the wise and God has chosen what is weak in the world to shame the strong. God has chosen what is insignificant and despised in the world – what is viewed as nothing p to bring to nothing what is viewed as something, so that no one may boast in his presence."

I shared that with the A-team, and with you now to say this: I'm not certain "why" God has placed me in the position to serve you and the churches of the Valley Rim in this interim season. I do know that it's not because of my qualifications, competencies, or really anything of my own merit. It is from that mindset that I have entered into this role, and as a result I have had two objectives during this season of transition for our association; (1) connect with as many pastors and church leaders as I could and pray diligently for them, and (2) learn as much as I can about associational life, the history of our association, and where I perceive our association to be currently.

So, then I will report on those two objectives. I have connected in some way, shape form or fashion, with 80% of our pastors, and attempted contact with 100% of our pastors. While I have been praying for each pastor and church in our association, the majority of these pastors I have had the opportunity to pray with either by phone or in person. This first objective is rather easy to quantify, the second is a slightly more anectdotal and relies largely on my own perception.

Many associations across the country are waning and associational leaders across North America are asking tough questions, and investing time, money, and energy into understanding the future of associational life. However, I firmly believe associational life as a whole is not going anywhere. Wherever there are churches, particularly SBC churches, pastors and local church leaders will seek one another out for partnerships, fellowship, or just to hang out.

Historically the Valley Rim SBA has been a strong association and often led the way in associational life in Arizona. Through conversations with our staff and many of the pastors, I quickly learned of story after story of churches working together in our association for the spread of Gospel. These stories provide a tremendous backdrop for the future of Valley Rim moving forward.

That leaves us with the current state of our association. Many of our churches are actively engaged in church planting. We aren't experiencing a financial crisis. Churches are baptizing, sending mission teams, and impacting their local communities. In short, our association of churches finds itself in a stable position. We aren't launching into the future, but we are not sliding into despair either.

2018 Associational Directors Report Continued

Through conversation with pastors and church leaders in the Valley Rim over the last nine months, there are two common themes that I have observed; uncertainty and apathy. Many pastors find themselves asking the question, "What is the association? What is its purpose? Why am I or why should I be involved in this?" Pastors are uncertain of the relevance of the traditional association in today's context and rapidly changing culture, even rapidly changing SBC culture. If pastors aren't uncertain then they are often apathetic toward associational life, expressing little to no interest, enthusiasm, or concern. They understand or at least at one time understood the significance of associations, but are no longer compelled to be actively engaged.

With these two sentiments so common among our pastors and churches, I offer these questions; What is cooperation? Why do we cooperate with one another? How do we cooperate with one another? As I previously mentioned I believe associations in some shape form or fashion will always exist. There is no reason to recreate the wheel, scrap what we know as the association, form a new group and call it a different name. Instead, at this time in the life of our association and in the life of our churches we need simply to redefine cooperation?

I don't necessarily have the answer to that question but I believe it is the conversation we need to be having. I will offer some frame work for that discussion. Our cooperation cannot simply be defined by the cooperative program, nor can it be defined as something we just do because we are Southern Baptists. Instead we need to define cooperation in the context of kingdom impact. How are 75 churches working together in the east valley and rim region of our state to impact 1.25 million people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ? The same thing that happens in churches, happens in associations. If we are not kingdom focused, we become inward focused, and are simply marking time until we find ourselves of no relevance or have closed our doors altogether.

I pray that you don't find this report discouraging in any way. Rather my prayer is that you will see we are poised as an association to have some honest discussion and make some strategic changes that will propel us into the future. A future not defined by the existence of an association but by kingdom cooperation that has an eternal impact.

He rededicated his life to the Lord, became a leader, and through helping lead a Challenge Community with another student, his faith grew the most it ever had. He has opened up his life to others and accepted discipleship, something that has been hard for him because of a disjointed family background. Just recently he got baptized and became a member of Hiway Baptist church. We are excited for Jonathon as he continues to help with ministry at his church and as his heart breaks for the students and others around him. He is an inspiration to those who have come from broken homes.






